ELEVATOR & BUILDING SAFETY

The Elevator Division enforces the Mississippi Conveyance Safety Act. That means overseeing all elevator and conveyance mechanics, inspectors, and companies that install, repair, maintain or inspect commercial elevators, dumbwaiters, escalators, moving walks, wheelchair lifts, and platform lifts in Mississippi. A searchable database of licenses is available on the MID website.

The division collected a total of \$296,762 in 2023-2024, including these fees

- \$249,437 Annual Operating Certificate
- \$13,800 Installation Permit
- \$11,600 Elevator Mechanic License

INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

The MID IT department continued efforts in 2023-2024 that helped staff work remotely by providing transparent and seamless technological support.

Other significant activities:

- Upgraded the department's network infrastructure
- · Upgraded the department's servers
- Continued upgrades of the department's operating systems and primary software, as well as upgrading applications and training users
- · Continued upgrades of the departments desktop computers and laptops
- Continued implementation of the department's internet and intranet websites
- Worked with all divisions to assess and evaluate workflows and create applications designed to make duties more efficient



LICENSING

The Licensing division is one of the busiest divisions within the MID, handling more than 12,000 calls and more than 32,000 emails for assistance in 2023-2024. Licensing is responsible for issuing licenses and appointments to individuals and business entities to engage in the business of insurance in the state of Mississippi.



FINANCIAL & MARKET REGULATION

The Finance and Market Division monitored the solvency of 2,616 companies with over \$22.4 billion premium written in Mississippi. The division also collected \$1.4 million in filing fees, analyzed over 500 domestic company filings, and managed \$51 million in pledged securities. The division assessed the financial condition and operations of 156 entities applying for a license to operate in Mississippi and monitored the company operations of 762 domestic and foreign companies. The division also participated in 1 multi-state collaborative action and commenced 10 examinations



LEGAL AFFAIRS & GENERAL COUNSEL

The legal division amended and issued a number of advisory bulletins and handled 81 open records requests. The division also represented the MID in administrative licensure matters resulting in fines and administrative penalties. Some of those penalties include 32 revocations of licenses and three cease and desist orders. Five fines were paid totaling \$138,773.18.

INVESTIGATIONS AND CONSUMER PROTECTION

The Investigations and Consumer Protection Division helped obtain \$445,923 in refunds/recoveries for consumers between March 1, 2023-February 29, 2024. The Division received over 800 calls/complaints.

As a direct result of these investigations, the Department imposed the following enforcement actions against insurance producers and bail agents:

- 3 Voluntary Surrenders of License
- 36 Revocations of License
- 1 Cease and Desist Order
- 4 fines totaling \$8,250



PUBLIC RELATIONS & COMMUNICATIONS

The Communications Division handles both internal and external communication for the MID. In 2023-2024, the division issued 39 news releases for the MID and the State Fire Marshal's Office. Topics include fire prevention, flood insurance, and life insurance.

The Division also promoted several special events including the ribbon cutting of a new dorm and training facility at the Mississippi State Fire Academy.

The Division is also responsible for managing media and advertising campaigns. The division sponsored a hurricane season preparedness campaign with WLOX and the Sun Herald on the Mississippi Coast which included TV commercials, newspaper ads, and digital advertising. A radio, TV, and digital media campaign from November to January targeted consumers with fire safety messaging. Other work included updating the MID website and staff photo directory and handling day-to-day media requests.



ACTUARY/HEALTH CARE REFORM

The Division reviewed approximately 4,310 electronic rate and form filing for life, health, accident, and annuity products and collected \$408,580.00 in electronic filing fees. The Division processed approximately 76 External Reviews for consumers throughout the year. Staff also provided daily guidance on questions received from insurers, providers, and consumers.

The Division also utilized grant funding from a Federal Grant, known as The State Flexibility Grant, Cycle I and Cycle II, to ensure the Mississippi laws, regulations and procedures are compatible and comply with federal requirements. Its objectives relate to policy form review, market conduct examinations, market analysis, and financial investigations. These state enhancements are effective in overseeing and enforcing the pre-selected market reforms and consumer protection.

The funds provided by CMS are assisting MID in conducting a comprehensive review of all in-state issuers' products in the health insurance market. MID is using grant funds to review the current form review policies and procedures. MID is also working to use the funds provided by this grant to (1) establish new compliance policies and procedures to govern the ongoing review of plans for discriminatory impact and (2) identify potentially discriminatory drug formularies.



PROPERTY & CASUALTY

The Division closed over 4,036 electronic filings through SERFF. The Division generated a total of \$360,202 in Filing Fees. The Division's staff provides the Commissioner of Insurance a summary of findings and recommendations for approval or disapproval on any new Property & Casualty program and/or any changes in rates to existing programs.

MISSISSIPPI STATE FIRE ACADEMY (MSFA)

The MSFA is committed and responsible for the training and education of personnel engaged in municipal, county, and industrial fire protection. This student body consists of career, volunteer, and industrial fire personnel. The Academy has three training areas, which are 1) Certification Services 2) Extension Services and 3) Industrial and Special Services, which all focus on the Academy's only function, which is training. All other areas support the staff and students of these training areas.

The Academy's philosophy is to deliver quality training and instruction to the fire service/emergency response personnel of the State, while adhering to high ethical standards, promoting cooperation among staff with efficiency and integrity in their work while representing the Academy in a professional, courteous, and helpful manner at all times, and safeguarding the assets of the State. The Academy is committed to providing excellent service to its customers by providing training based on National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) standards as well as specialized courses not addressed by NFPA.

KELLY ELLIOTT EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Kelly Elliott was named Executive Director of the MSFA in July 2023. Elliott previously served as the Fire Chief of the Tupelo Fire Department. He also served as the 172nd Airlift Wing Command Chief at Thompson Field in Jackson and continues serving as a drill member. Elliott was an instructor at the Mississippi State Fire Academy from 1998-2003.



The mission of the State Fire Marshal's Office (SFMO) is to foster, promote and develop ways and means of protecting life and property from fire and related perils through direct action and coordination with Mississippi fire and law enforcement services.



FIRE DEATHS

SFMO investigated 78 fire deaths between March 1, 2023-February 29, 2024. The K-9 unit, comprised of three K-9s, was called out 91 times and received 475 hours of training. It's estimated that the investigated fires caused more than \$52 million in loss of property and contents. Insurance coverage on the buildings was app. \$95 million. Insurance coverage on contents was app. \$13 million.

SFMO investigated 11 wildland fires.

FIRE SERVICES DEVELOPMENT

The Division was created in 1988 for the purpose of overseeing the accountability and distribution of State Fire Funds to counties and municipalities. Fire Services Development is also responsible for overseeing the Rural Fire Truck Acquisition Assistance Program (RFTAAP) along with Supplemental Rural Fire Truck Acquisition Assistance Program (SRFTAAP). This Division also manages the Mississippi Fire Incident Reporting System which is used by all fire departments in the state.

FIRE SAFETY EDUCATION

The Fire Safety Education Division offers education programs that comply with nationally recognized standards aimed at reducing the loss of life and property from fires.

In 2023-2024, the division

- Obtained 32,500 smoke alarms through grant funding
- Attended 11 Fire safety conferences
- Delivered more than 200 smoke alarms statewide
- 472 Fire Department Trainings & Visits
- 90 Public Education Programs and Presentations
- 45 event participations (booths at fairs, etc.)
- Increased Fire Safety Education Division from, 1 staff member to 3

SFMO continues to serve as a primary agency with Emergency Coordination Officers for Emergency Support Function (ESF) 4, Firefighting, at the State Emergency Operations Center at the Mississippi Emergency Management Agency (MEMA).
